Curtis, though a bit more rebellious than I was, had done better in his schoolwork. Yet his grades weren't good enough to meet mother's standards either. Evening after evening mother talked with Curtis, working with him on his attitude, urging him to want to succeed, pleading with him not to give up on himself. Neither of us had a role model of success or even a respected male figure to look up to. I think Curtis being older, was more sensitive to that than I was. "Ben", she said again and again, "If you can read honey, you can learn just about anything you want to know. The doors of the world are open to people who can read. And my boys are going to be successful in life, because they are going to be the best readers in the school.

As I think about it, I am as convinced today as I was back in the fifth grade, that my mother meant that. She believed in Curtis and me. She had such faith in us, we didn't dare to fail! Her unbounced confidence nudged me into starting to believe in myself.

Several of mother's friends criticized her strictness. I heard one woman ask, "What are you doing to those boys, making them study all the time? They're going to hate you."

"They can hate me," she answered, cutting off the woman's criticism, but they are going to get a good education just the same!"

Of course I never hated her. I did not like the pressure, but she managed to make me realise that this hard work was for my good. Almost daily, she would say, "Ben, you can do anything you set yourself to do."

It has been discovered that people who have friends are happier and healthier than those without. Therefore it is important to think of how you can keep the friends that you have and how to make new ones. They say that people with close friends have greater ability to fight illness than those who are solitary.

Friendship needs to be cultivated. Find time to be with your friends even if it means putting off something you would like to do. People are more important than things and relating well with other people brings much joy to our lives. When it is not possible to be with your friends, keep contact through letters or the telephone.

We should learn to open to our close friends. This means that we should be willing to share our inner feelings with them. Tell them about your fears and worries, your hopes and desires. Why should we do this? Because we should be free to be ourselves before our true friends. In other words, we don't fear that we shall be misunderstood. Friends should accept us just the way we are and encourage us to overcome our weakness. After all, none of us is perfect.

Similarly, listen to your friends when they have problems, but offer advice only when it is wanted. Do not impose your will on others. Encourage them to do what they think is best for them. When your friends are shaken after going through a difficult experience, be there for them.

Have different friends for different activities such as singing in a choir, participating in sports or helping in a community project. Associating with different kind of people broadens your outlook and enriches your life. Learn to show sincere interest in what other people are doing. This will draw them to you.

If your friend has a need, do not wait for him or her to ask for a favour. When a friend has too much work, offer to assist; if he or she is sick, ask what you can do to help.

By now you have probably realized that it is not easy to maintain friendship. But it is worth the effort. If you are friendly, kind and considerate, people will be attracted to you. Talk to strangers and people who seem lonely. As you meet the needs of others, your own needs will be met.

Do not take friendship for granted. Do things that will strengthen it and avoid habits that kill relationship. If you are envious and selfish, people will avoid you like the plague. If you lie and gossip about your friends, they will soon begin treating you like a leper. So, do for your friends what you would like them to do for you. Laugh with them when they are happy, celebrate their successes and weep with them when they are sorrowful. Remember without friends, life would be unbearable.
